Are you eligible for EFMP?

EFMP enrollment criteria is determined on a case by case basis. The enrollment process is initiated at the EFMP Medical Office in the hospital. EFMP families may have members who experience physical, intellectual, emotional, or developmental disabilities that require special attention to include counseling, therapies, treatments, special education and training. Some of our EFMP family members have special learning conditions, while others may have medical conditions like asthma, autism, cancer, seizures, PTSD and many more. For children, they may require an IEP or a 504-Plan to facilitate them getting appropriate assistance/accommodations in order to thrive in the school system. Ultimately, EFMP enrollment is determined by medical professionals in conjunction with the EFMP Medical Office guided by DoDI 1315.19.



Who We Serve

The **EFMP Family Support Office** assists ALL DoD ID-card holders with at least one family member with special needs (adult or child). This includes active and retired members and their dependents from all branches of service. It also includes Reserve, National Guard, and Coalition members and their families, along with DOD employees and contractors.


