# HOW TO MANAGE STRESS AS A PARENT OF A CHILD WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Stress is common in any family. But in a special needs family, it is alarmingly common. In fact, many parents suffer from post-traumatic stress and health problems secondary to stress. Parenting a child with special needs brings with it many additional challenges—compared to parenting a "neurotypical" child—such as behavioral problems, educational issues, additional financial pressures and the effect on siblings, to name a few. However, there is good news: you can learn to better manage stress and when you do, the entire family benefits.

Here are some effective ways to best manage your stress as a parent of a special-needs child:



-Identify your sources of stress
-Become an expert on your child's condition

-Get healthy
-Do not judge yourself too harshly
-Don't ignore your stress
-Develop a stress management toolkit



Tools include the following:

- Develop lifestyle changes, such as exercise, listening to music or eating well.
- Build positive relationships and consciously spend time with people who make you feel good.
- Engage in activities that put you in a positive state. Have fun because you deserve it.
- Journaling is like having a conversation with your own subconscious mind.

Taking time to nurture yourself as a parent of a special needs child is not selfish, it is essential. Stress is highly personal and so is stress management. So take control of your stress and do it soon. You and your family deserve to be living balanced, thriving lives. As always, if you need resources, we are here for you.

#### Supporting Active Duty Military Families

The 2014 Florida Legislature authorized individuals who meet the eligibility requirements of 393.065(1), F.S., to receive home and community-based services in this state if the individual's parent or legal guardian is an active duty military service member and, at the time of the service member's transfer to Florida, the individual was receiving home and community-based services in another state. This law became effective on July 1, 2014.

#### What are the eligibility requirements for APD?

To be eligible for services from the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, the individual must be:

- 3 years of age or older, and have a developmental disability before the age 18
- · A Florida resident \*
- Diagnosed with one of the following seven developmental disabilities listed in Chapter 393, Florida Statutes: autism, cerebral palsy, intellectual disabilities, Down syndrome, Prader-Willi syndrome, spina bifida, Phelan-McDermid syndrome or children age 3-5 who are at a high risk of a developmental disability

\* Effective July 1, 2014, individuals whose parents or legal guardian are in active duty military service are eligible to apply to APD and be enrolled in the iBudget waiver if the person was receiving waiver services from the state they were living in prior to Florida.

#### What services does APD provide?

The agency provides services that help individuals to live, learn and work in their communities The types of services that APD provides under the waiver are grouped in eight service families. These are Life Skills Development (companion services, supported employment and adult day training). Supplies and Equipment, Personal Supports (personal care assistance), Residential Services, Support Coordination (Case Management), Therapeutic Supports and Wellness (behavior analysis services, physical therapy, occupational therapy, etc.), Transportation, and Dental Services for adults over the age of 21. APD does not provide medical services. However, once a person meets Medicaid eligibility, the individual may receive medical services from the Florida Medicaid system operated by the Agency for Health Care Administration.
