Alaska SLPs, **Earnest Kincaide and Adele Daniels**, representing **Eielson AFB and JBBER**, visited Juneau to support Coast Guard (CG) families. A notable highlight of the trip was their meeting with Juneau School District (JSD) Superintendent Hauser, during which they discussed strategies for enhancing support for military-connected families through specialized programs, resources, and partnership opportunities.

Superintendent Hauser joined the SLPs in a meeting with Rear Admiral Bob Little, Commander of the Arctic District, U.S. Coast Guard, and his staff. This discussion focused on fostering a robust relationship between the CG and the JSD. The SLPs also met with key staff member Ms. Tanya Preusser, Southeast Alaska Coast Guard Family Resource Specialist, who emphasized her role in supporting families with special needs. This conversation opened avenues for the Alaska SLPs to explore ongoing support and partnership initiatives.

Beyond compliance inspections, what truly defines success is the visible impact on families, schools, and mission readiness. A strong program demonstrates:

- **Trusted Partnerships:** Collaborations with schools, districts, and joint service teams that build credibility and influence at community and state levels.
- **Mission-Relevant Outcomes:** School-based programming, professional development for educators, and active roles in crisis action planning that directly support commanders and families.
- **Data-Driven Decisions:** Capturing trends, reporting education challenges, and linking results to readiness, retention, and recruiting.
- **Enterprise Alignment:** Partnering with the Defense State Liaison Office and sharing best practices that shape DoD and Air Force policy.



Bottom Line: A program that goes beyond compliance is one that is trusted, visible, and produces measurable results for families, schools, and commanders—while also shaping enterprise policy and sharing innovations across the joint force.

Commander's Tips: Driving a Successful School Liaison Program



- **Champion Partnerships:** Publicly support your School Liaison's engagement with schools, districts, and community leaders. Your presence reinforces credibility.
- **Ask for Data:** Request regular updates on education trends, MIC3 cases, and family feedback to inform your decisions.
- **Connect the Dots:** Tie education issues directly to readiness, retention, and recruiting in command messaging.
- **Empower the Role:** Ensure your SLP has a seat at the table—especially in crisis planning, councils, and working groups.
- **Share the Wins:** Highlight education successes in commander's calls and reports. Visibility shows families you care about their children's future.

Leader's Bottom Line: When commanders actively endorse and integrate the School Liaison Program, it transforms from a compliance requirement into a force multiplier for mission success.

Highlighting Best Practices: Wright Patterson AFB Special Needs Parent Support Group

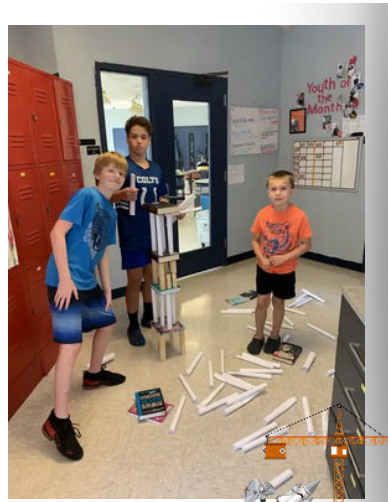

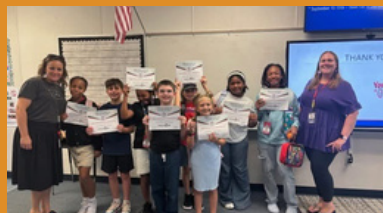
Bounce Back Better: Inside School-Based Programming

Anchored4Life (A4L) is a comprehensive resilience and leadership development program designed to support students through life's transitions. Centered on peer-to-peer connection, the program fosters a culture of encouragement, positive reinforcement, and the cultivation of essential life skills. Operating within schools, A4L equips both student leaders and adult advisors with training and ongoing support to promote collaboration and personal growth.

The program is specifically tailored to address the unique challenges encountered by mobile and military-connected students, offering critical assistance during deployments and other transitions. Ultimately, A4L aims to enhance academic performance while facilitating healthy social and emotional adjustments within the school community.

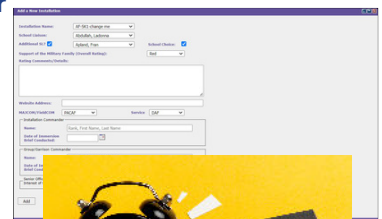
-  A.1.h.4 | SLP has a strategic communication plan to ensure stakeholders (commanders, families, schools and community) are aware of programs and services.
